Parenting support and information

Developmental trends in children's self-concept

The ideas, beliefs and knowledge that children have about who they are, what they can do and where they fit in society help to shape their understanding of themselves. Children base their self-concepts on feedback they receive from others as well as their own judgments. The kinds of things that primary school children take into account in developing their self-concepts include how well they are able to succeed with schoolwork and other activities, how they look, and how they get on with family and peers. Developmental patterns in the ways children typically describe themselves are related to their developing capacities

for thinking and for understanding and managing their emotions and behaviour. Preschool children often have very high opinions of their abilities. They can describe physical appearance, family context and favourite activity. During primary school, children become much more aware of how their abilities and achievement compare with those of others.

It is very important for children's strengths and efforts to be recognised in order to support the development of a positive self-concept and to motivate children to be positive engaged in learning and in their relationships. Poor self-concept can be a significant contributing factor to children's emotional and behavioural difficulties.
