

Criteria 1 – Built on A4 sized foundation plate (thick brown cardboard) Criteria 2 – House should be 21x15x21 (the base of the house should be no larger than an A5 piece of paper) Criteria 3 – include at least 2 doors and 2 windows. The doors must be able to be opened.

Criteria 4 – Must be constructed from recyclable materials. We will be conducting a fair test on each house. I think we will get a 4 star rating. When we have completed out test we will see who has the best cyclone proof house. My hypothesis is that we will use a low powered leaf blower to test it. Students were very respectful and represented the school admirably. The ceremony was an outdoor Federal Court Session. This has been decades in preparation with the last 3 years seeing lawyers and many other officials becoming involved to support Nauo's Native Title Claim. All the officials spoke well and we were acknowledged for our support of Nauo's land connection and culture. Our work with Jodie and Scott has been great as many of you know. We feel honoured to be part of this historic event.

On Monday we also had the Questacon Science team visit the school. They ran some highly energised science experiments for the students. Students enjoyed the performance and some students were lucky enough to be involved. A big thanks to the Questacon team and we look forward to seeing them next year.

On Tuesday the Upper Primary class went to the basketball carnival at Navigator College. It was a great day watching all students take part and try their best. The Division B, Poole A group did really well only narrowly missing out on the finals. They won 3 out of 4 games which was great. 

On Monday the 8th of May, 61 students from Elliston, Streaky Bay and Cummins Areas Schools, Penong Primary School, Lake Wangary School, Port Lincoln High School, Navigators and St Joseph's School participated in the 2023 West Coast Schools Surf Competition. The competitors gathered at a location near Walkers Rocks and were presented with clean, offshore conditions early and small swell suitable for all age groups.

With over half the competitors from the junior age groups, the day began at the beach with small peeling, offshore waves. All entrances experienced success with plenty of green faces on offer. The smiles on all participants and the laughter in new friendships, was another highlight for the day.

After completing their first heat at the junior bank, the older students moved down the beach to ride larger waves for their second heat.
